INTRODUCTION

The first began t s skiing bind to 4,500 years old version of the beginning of the use of skis as transportation means.

However, the cave records in the pictures show that this happened much earlier.

Norwegians are credited with developing skiing as a sporting activity back in 1870.

Before 18 9, Montenegrins used so-called payments, and they were used to cross the expanses of Montenegro, for practical reasons.

1 8 9 first Norwegian captain Hernik Angel, ava nturista with a pair of skis out of the Monte Negro, like "The Devil in the W wires while". At the request of Montenegrin Sven Niko le, he started training skiing of Montenegrin feathers.

They founded the club Cetinje Ski Association in 1892. and start with a ski school, and the king himself orders the first skis from Vienna. 1895 Henrik Angel publishes a book "Through Montenegro on Skis", describes Montenegrins as very skilled on skis, and at the same time in Nikšić, carpenter Backović makes the first skis in Montenegro.

Further development of skiing is linked between the Second World War and the visit of special units of the occupiers, to which Montenegrins " took over " some equipment to participate in numerous actions and the transfer of mail and medicines during and after the war.

As a thank you to Captain Angel, an Angel Cup was established.

In 1893, the first club was established in Montenegro in Cetinje by some sources and the first in the SFRY.

It took 4 decades for Montenegrins to start organizing skiing on the slopes of Bjelasica.

1933 is the year when the ski society was organized in Kolasin.

Slovenian serving military service, organized a lecture on skiing.

There are reports that a group of Swiss tourists passed through Bjelasica in 1905.

Ski competitions are organized "at Orjen, Crkvice where 45 skiers are registered, Lovćen is also a venue for young skiers competitions.

After World War II in 1949. On March 22 and 23, Kolašin hosts the first Republican competition in Montenegro. In the same year, the Ski Association of Montenegro was founded and clubs from Zabljak, Niksic, Rozaj, Savnik, Bijelo Polje, Titograd, Plav, Kotor and Herceg Novi are members of the newly formed Ski Association.

In the 60s, the famous Janez Rolda trained jumpers on Zabljak.

In 1962, the Nordics from the YU area are in Zabljak, in the same year a 60 meter long jump is being built. In 1965, a championship was held in Zabljak, in 11 disciplines. The Slovenes took all the first places.

In the 1970s, Nikšić gathered over 150 competitors.

During the 70's and 80's, skiing woke up, equipment was purchased, leading Kolašinci and Žabljak residents.

Skiing yesterday, today and tomorrow

There are 16 clubs active, as much interest and financial support as possible.

For the last 5 years since the slalom and giant slalom courses have been approved, the FIS competitions, the Cup of Small Nations with over 70 competitors from 19 countries in the Alpine and Nordic disciplines, have been held regularly.

All senior competitions in Montenegro are of international character.

There are different grades of performance of non-Montenegrin skiers, but we have to agree that without good winter centers there are no good skiers.

The famous wingman who is the best teacher?

Of course, the lift, the cable car.

The first cable car from Kotor to Lovcen, although freight and built 1916.god. d uga 2607 meters with a vertical drop of 963 me today is the longest and tallest, unfortunately does not work. He's competing for some new time.

With the formation of winter centers in Montenegro, the first elevators of the 70s began to be built on Zabljak, Kolašin, Vučje, Kosanica, Smiljevci, Bjelasica, Ivanova korita.

The Ski Association is separating itself from the mountaineering association and is gently taking over the organization in technical and technological terms for Montenegro.

The Ministry of Sport with the Olympic Committee supports all the activities of the clubs and the Alliance.

New Winter Centers are being built, cable cars are being developed, the media is more closely following the events in the mountains.

Organized ski schools in cities do not give the desired results to get quality from the masses.

The education of ski judges, lifts, lifeguards, ski instructors, and specialized crews is a prerequisite for improving skiing and white sports in special conditions .

Yet, in the last decade or two since the emergence of statehood, we have achieved quite solid results.
